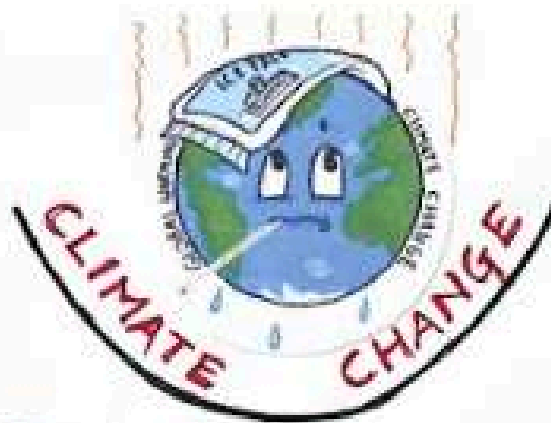
Rustle goes the leaves,
